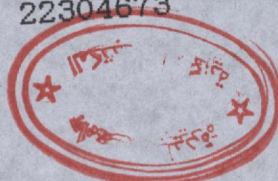

**7** Private funding looks unlikely to help clear the log-jam in US stem-cell research as it may drive out federal funding if used on new stem-cell lines. Since President Bush decided in August 2001 to allow government funding only on research with the 60 existing stem cell lines, private funding can now be used to create new lines, but this money has to be kept separate from public funds.

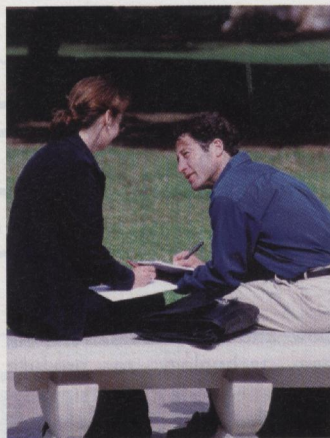
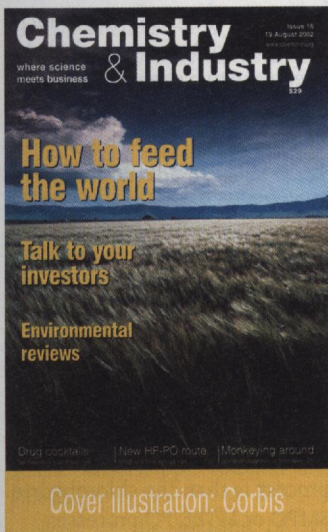
